So in Christ Jesus you are all children of God through faith, ²⁷ for all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. ²⁸ There is neither Jew nor Gentile, neither slave nor free, nor is there male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus.

1 Corinthians 7:17, 20, 24 ^{NIV}

¹⁷ Nevertheless, each person should live as a believer in whatever situation the Lord has assigned to them, just as God has called them. This is the rule I lay down in all the churches.

²⁰ Each person should remain in the situation they were in when God called them.

²⁴ Brothers and sisters, each person, as responsible to God, should remain in the situation they were in when God called them.

Matthew 5:11-12 ^{NIV}

“Blessed are you when people insult you, persecute you and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of me. ¹² Rejoice and be glad, because great is your reward in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you.”



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Who decides what counts as an improvement or as progress in humanity? It can be none other than “us,” human beings in our current state. 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...To compound this, the “we” who decides what counts as improvement is not humanity in general but almost certainly a very particular group of humans: the plan is to subject us all to a white, middle-class, modern Western male view of the “perfect” human. The prospect of one group thus defining improvement for all “is like a man’s right eye claiming to rule him, or his left leg to run away with him. It is madness.

1 Corinthians 7:18-19 ^{NIV}

Was a man already circumcised when he was called? He should not become uncircumcised. Was a man uncircumcised when he was called? He should not be circumcised. ¹⁹ Circumcision is nothing and uncircumcision is nothing. Keeping God's commands is what counts.

1 Corinthians 7:21-23 ^{NIV}

Were you a slave when you were called? Don't let it trouble you—although if you can gain your freedom, do so. ²² For the one who was a slave when called to faith in the Lord is the Lord's freed person; similarly, the one who was free when called is Christ's slave. ²³ You were bought at a price; do not become slaves of human beings.



Luke 4:42-44 ^{NIV}

At daybreak, Jesus went out to a solitary place. The people were looking for him and when they came to where he was, they tried to keep him from leaving them. ⁴³ But he said, "I must proclaim the good news of the kingdom of God to the other towns also, because that is why I was sent." ⁴⁴ And he kept on preaching in the synagogues of Judea.

James 2:14-17 ^{NIV}


What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone claims to have faith but has no deeds? Can such faith save them? ¹⁵ Suppose a brother or a sister is without clothes and daily food. ¹⁶ If one of you says to them, “Go in peace; keep warm and well fed,” but does nothing about their physical needs, what good is it? ¹⁷ In the same way, faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead.



The church exists to help people become reconciled to God and each other, not primarily to change their temporary circumstances.

However, those who have been reconciled to God will always love others in tangible ways.
