


CROSS-SHAPED FREEDOM

Freedom to love.






Cross-shaped freedom compels us to give up our rights

Deuteronomy 6:4-9 ^{NIV}


Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one. ⁵ **Love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength.** ⁶ These commandments that I give you today are to be on your hearts. ⁷ Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up. ⁸ Tie them as symbols on your hands and bind them on your foreheads. ⁹ Write them on the doorframes of your houses and on your gates.



But not everyone possesses this knowledge. Some people are still so accustomed to idols that when they eat sacrificial food they think of it as having been sacrificed to a god, and since their conscience is weak, it is defiled. ⁸ But food does not bring us near to God; we are no worse if we do not eat, and no better if we do.









Cross-shaped freedom gives up to build up.


